Target Words





KS2 SATs Busters:

Set C Test 4 of Reading, Grammar Punctuation and Spelling and Maths.

Mathletics

Maths homework will reflect the learning that is done in class during the week. It is set every Friday on Mathletics

Spelling

Spellings are set every Friday with a spelling test the following Friday giving children one week to learn them. The spelling rule this week is words with the /f/ sound spelled 'ph'.

(Your child should have received a card with all of their homework passwords on). Reading in Key Stage 2

Handy Hints

- Make reading part of your daily routine.
- Short sessions 15 minutes per day.
- Continue to read out loud to an adult as well as independently.
- Try to read a range of books including fiction and non-fiction.
- Complete the Accelerated Reader quiz at home, ideally within 24-48 hours of finishing the book.



How can parents help?

Reading improves with practice.

Encourage your child to read at home, share your own books, discuss books, ask questions about the book they have read and visit the local library.

Check that your child is completing the reading quiz – this is part of their weekly homework.
