### DT Day – 15<sup>th</sup> July-

The children will be creating their own ice lollies next week and we ask that they bring in some ingredients to support them in this process. Please can children bring; chopped fruit (**please do not bring in whole fruit as we will not be using knives as part of this lesson**) and a small carton of juice/squash/smoothie. As a team, we will provide the moulds to make the ice lollies and any surplus ingredients we think the children might want to use (dependent upon allergies). Children will then eat their creations the next day at school.

### End of term-

Children's books will be released to them on the final day of school and so we ask that they bring in a plastic bag to transport them home. On occasions, we like to hold back a couple of books to showcase the children's work to visitors of the school in the Autumn and Spring terms.
