# Our Week in Year 1



Below are some of the things we have learnt this week. Your child might like to tell you a little more about a few of these:

Continued our new topic in RE called 'Creation and Covenant' and learnt about what stewardship looks like.

Maths -learning about number order, using greater than and less than vocabulary and the order of numbers on a number line.

Continued with sentence writing and learned about using finger spaces correctly, linked to our book this half term, The Gingerbread Man.

Handwriting - began learning about correct letter formation and position on the line - see quidance below.

History - We continued our learning about how we are making history. We compared things we have now compared to things in the past, finding differences and similarities!

Art - We continued with our drawing topic, developing our mark making techniques and using a variety of art mediums.


Boxes of chocolate - these are put into parcels at Christmas

#### Notes for parents

Oracy October! - Oracy is all about how we talk and listen to others. The Oracy Framework (see diagram below) can help you decide which speaking, listening and communication skills you need in different situations. It breaks these skills down into four strands: physical, linguistic, cognitive and social-emotional. At school we use this framework to support your child's oracy so we wanted to share it with you so you can support their speaking at home too.



- <u>Lunches It is important that you order your child's lunch at home</u>. We are finding there are a number of children each day without a lunch. This is very unsettling for your child and causes a lot of disruption to the office staff.
- Please can you make sure your child's book bag is clearly named so adults can see who's
  it is and there is only one small keyring on it. The book bags go in boxes so we're
  finding they can't all fit because of the keyrings!
- Please remind your child when it is their Library day: Skylarks (Monday and Thursday) / Swans (Monday and Friday). Your child can only take out a new book when they have returned their old book. Please keep books in their bags to help with this.
