

Reading



- Children are to read at least 10 minutes a day at home. Even if they are a confident independent reader they should read aloud with an adult.
- Children (not doing RWI) have a ZPD (linked to Accelerated reader) and their books are to be within this range.
- Children will go to the library once a week (Wednesday Jays, Thursday Owls) children will choose a book to take home- will be notified if it is late.
- When they complete books, the children complete an Accelerated reader quiz. A complete quiz over 80% will move the children up on the reading race.



Spellings

- Children are taught a spelling rule each week in class. This is based on the national curriculum spelling list for year 3 & 4.
- The rule is linked to the spellings of the week. Children need to practice these words in and out of sequence.
- Children need to learn the rules and be able to apply them in written work.
- Spellings will be on the weekly newsletter.





- We want children to maintain a high standard of presentation in their work.
- We expect children to use joined up handwriting- support will be given in class with this.
- Children are taught to edit and improve their writing- and that it is ok to make corrections.
- A wide range of grammar and punctuation is taught throughout the year.
- Children will earn a pen license at different points throughout the yearthis is when consistently show high standards with their handwriting and presentation.

Homework

- Homework set on a Friday and expected to be completed by the following Friday.
- Any issues with logging in, let the class teacher know ASAP.
- Spellings- Edshed.
- Times table Rockstars- 21 minutes a week (more on this shortly)
- Regular reading at home-completing quizzes when they finish books.
- Maths.co.uk is our new Maths homework platform. The first homework will be set this Friday (19.9.25). Logins are the same as last year.


Times table check.

- In June, children will have a national test to ensure children have fluency with the times tables.
- Soundcheck on TTRS emulates the conditions of the test.
- We send home times table tests each week so you can monitor your child's progress.
- Learning times tables is essential in mathematics progress as it is the fundamental skills required throughout the curriculum in upper Key Stage 2.
