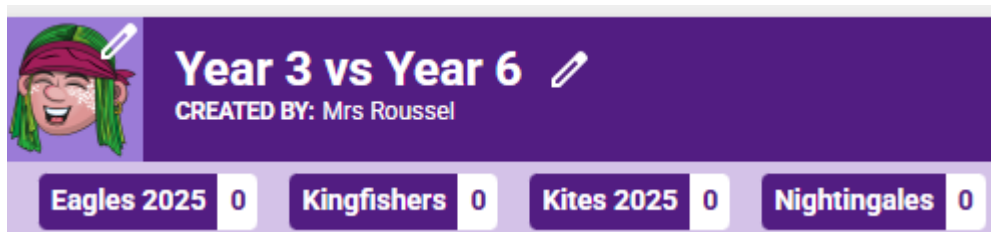
Fundraising

If your child is in the choir for Summer Term, they can rehearse using the following link:


