(The story of Advent using Godly Play)

We have had a lovely but wet week in Reception. Your child might like to tell you a little bit about some of things we have been learning this week:

- We enjoyed our Christmas Art day and made lots of lovely decorations to bring home at the end of term
- We have continued practising for our Nativity. Making sure that we use clear, loud voices and join in with all of the songs and dances. We are nearly ready for the actual performance!
- We continued to look at the characters from the Nativity story and drew and labelled our Nativity scenes
- In RE we talked about Advent and how it is a special time that we use to prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas. We listened to the Advent Story as our teachers used "Godly Play" to act it out
- We are counting down to Jesus' birthday by opening our class Advent calendars each day. Only three weeks until the big day.
- We shared the story of "One Snowy Night" and looked at lots of different nouns in the story.
- In Maths we explored 2D shapes and drew wonderful Christmas pictures by drawing around them.
- In music we continued to learn our new Nativity songs
- In Phonics we continued to learn about special friends and blending.
- In PE we worked together to make high shapes and low shapes

Notes for parents

• The Nativity dress rehearsal is on Tuesday the 9th December. The children should arrive in school in their costumes with their uniform in a named bag to change into afterwards. Please also ensure each item of clothing and any accessories are clearly

named. The costumes will stay in school until the actual Nativity performance to parents which is on Thursday the 11th December. The children will get dressed into their costumes at school.

- If your child has been given some words to say in our Nativity play, please continue to practise over the weekend. The louder and slower the better!
- A Christmas post box has arrived in Reception. The children will have the opportunity
 to post their Christmas cards in the post box and they will then be delivered to our
 classes. To ensure the correct card arrives, please include the class name and
 surnames on the cards
- The children will not be taking a library book home now until the New Year. We still have some books that have not been returned. If you know that your child's library book is at home please return it ASAP
- <u>Lunches</u> Each day we still have a small number of children without an ordered lunch. Not only does this cause additional work to staff but it often upsets the children when they are not able to have their preference. **Please**, **please order your child's lunch at home**. 
Wednesday 17th December - School Christmas lunch.

We would like to invite you to take part in our special project called 'The Travelling Crib'.

Each night one family from the class will play host to the 'Holy family' in the form of a nativity set. This is to help us remember the journey Mary and Joseph made to Bethlehem, and as a family take time to stop and think about the true meaning of Christmas.

The night you have the crib in your house we ask you set up the crib scene and switch on the candle. After that follow the script in the accompanying leaflet and take a few moments to be silent and reflect on what Christmas means to you. The enclosed prayer can then be said.
