Our Week in Year 1



Below are some of the things we have learnt this week. Your child might like to tell you a little more about a few of these:

In Maths, we have learnt about number bonds within and up to 10. We have used our part whole model to help us to further understand a number sentence. Please see below some additional information on part-whole model and how you can support your child with this at home.

In English, we practised our sentence writing remembering our 5 rules for sentence writing (group of words, it makes sense, capital letter at the start, full stop at the end and finger spaces after every word).

Handwriting, we continued learning about correct letter formation and position on the line - see guidance below.

In Science, we finished our topic by looking at how we use our senses in everyday life.

In History, we recognised Black History Month by learning about the achievements of Matthew Henson, an Arctic explorer from the 1900s.

In DT, we enjoyed making and decorating our gingerbread man.

Daily reading of the Read Write Inc. books (and any other books you may have at home) and library book.



2. Practise writing number sentences using a part whole model to show the whole number (up to 10) and how it can be put into two parts. Below is an example of what you can do on paper at home, along with a blank example that you can print or copy at home.

Handwriting Guidance


Handwriting Position:
