Routes available

Fee paying

We have 3 routes available to fee-paying trainees.

QTS only: this can be undertaken on a **fulltime** or **part-time** basis, agreed with your host school. You need qualified teacher status (QTS) to teach in most schools in England.

Assessment: completed through end of term reviews and lesson observation.

PGCE with QTS: undertaken on a **fulltime** basis. Accredited by University of Sussex, the PGCE provides a stronger grounding in educational research and academic theory. It is an internationally recognised qualification and is the better option if you may want to teach overseas. It also counts as 60 credits towards a masters. There are 8 additional lectures.

Assessment: in addition to end of term reviews and observation, you will complete one assignment and one professional conversation.

Apprenticeships

If you have experience of working in a school, your school may be willing to support your training through an apprenticeship. The expectations for this differ in that you will have your own class and be paid as an apprentice. This route may be suitable for HLTAs, unqualified teachers and LSAs.

Due to the nature of the program, this is usually offered to grant QTS only.

SEND enhanced

Through an exclusive partnership with Ridgeway Farnham, we can offer training in preparation for a job in specialist settings. This will involve specialist training and a placement in one of our specialist settings.

Requirements and how to apply

Requirements

- A degree (or equivalent) with a 2:2 or above,
- GCSEs (English, maths and science) grade C (or 4) or above or equivalent qualifications,
- Evidence at application of the ability to demonstrate a high standard of standard written English,
- Complete a 'Fitness to Teach' health questionnaire,
- Enhanced DBS check completed before enrolling.

What do I do if I do not meet the entry requirements?

Firstly, don't panic. This is s a lot of help out there. To check if you may have equivalent qualifications from abroad, contact ENIC on https://www.enic.org.uk

If you do not have the required GCSEs, you will need to sit an equivalence test. For more information, please get in touch so we can talk through next steps.

FAQs

Should I do PGCE or QTS only?

This entirely depends on you. QTS is the required qualified teaching status to teach in England. The PGCE qualification comes with QTS plus Masters credits which grounds your practice in theory.

My degree isn't related to the National Curriculum. Does that matter?

Not at all, we accept applications from all candidates who meet the qualifications.

How much time do I need to spend in school before applying?

Spending time in school will reinforce your decision to become a teacher but there is no requirement to spend time in school before making an application.

What are the working hours?

This varies dependent on school, however standard working hours are 8-4:30. Outside of this, you will be required to attend specific meetings such as weekly staff meetings. You can also volunteer your time for wider school experiences, such as Christmas Fairs. Your placement schools would discuss this in further

I don't have one of my GCSEs. Can I still apply?

Absolutely! The GCSE requirements need to be met by the beginning of the course and we are able to offer opportunities to take equivalency tests.

Can I get financial support?

I haven't finished my degree. Can I still apply?

Of course and in these circumstances any offer on the course would be conditional to your successful completion of your degree.
